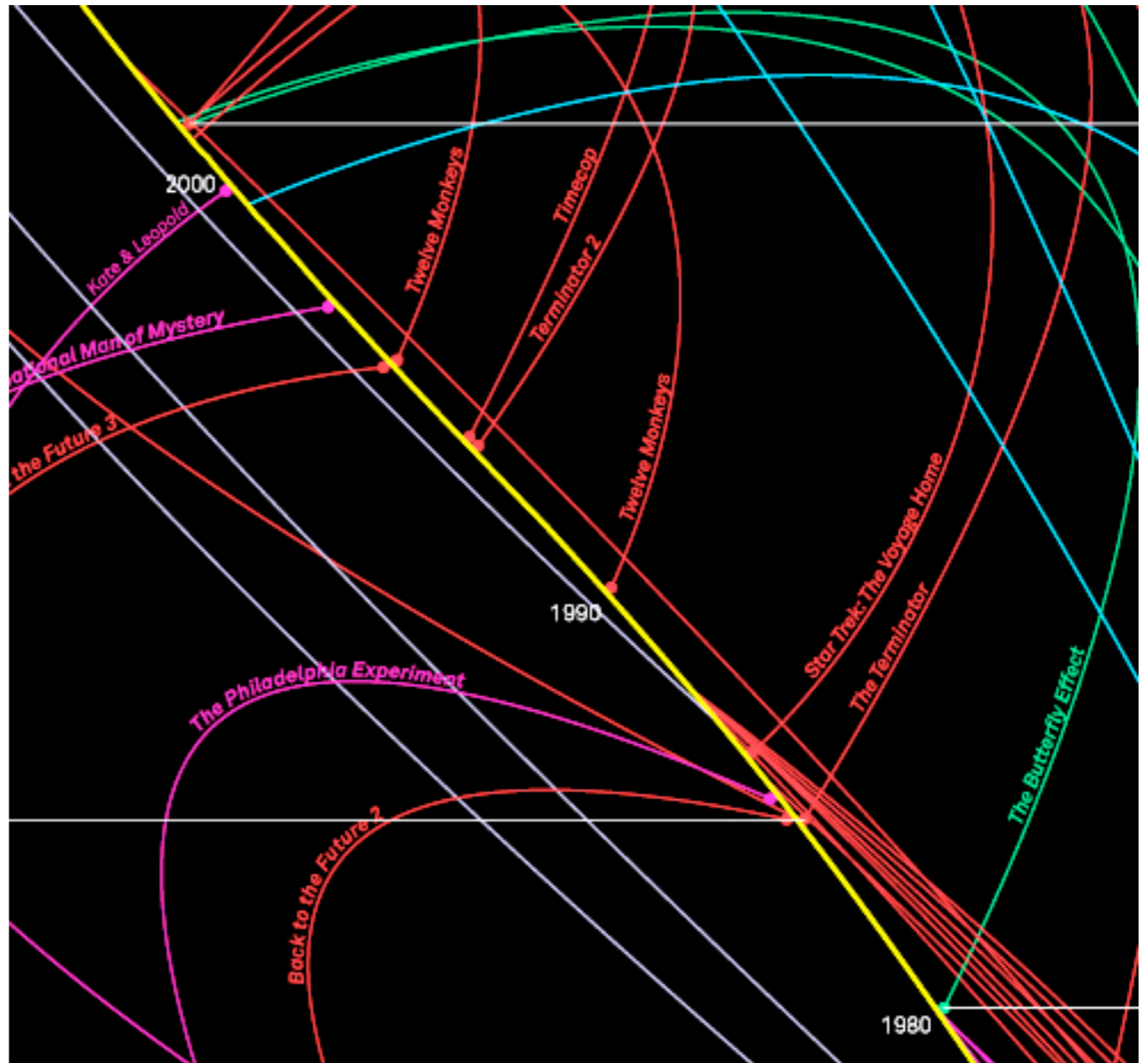
Born In Boston

Edward Moore Kennedy is born in Boston, the youngest of nine children. His father, Joseph P. Kennedy Sr., and his mother, the former Rose Fitzgerald, came from prominent Irish Catholic families with long involvement in the Democratic politics of Boston and Massachusetts. His father, who made a fortune in real estate, movies and banking, served in President Franklin D. Roosevelt's administration, first as chairman of the Securities and Exchange Commission and then as ambassador to Britain.



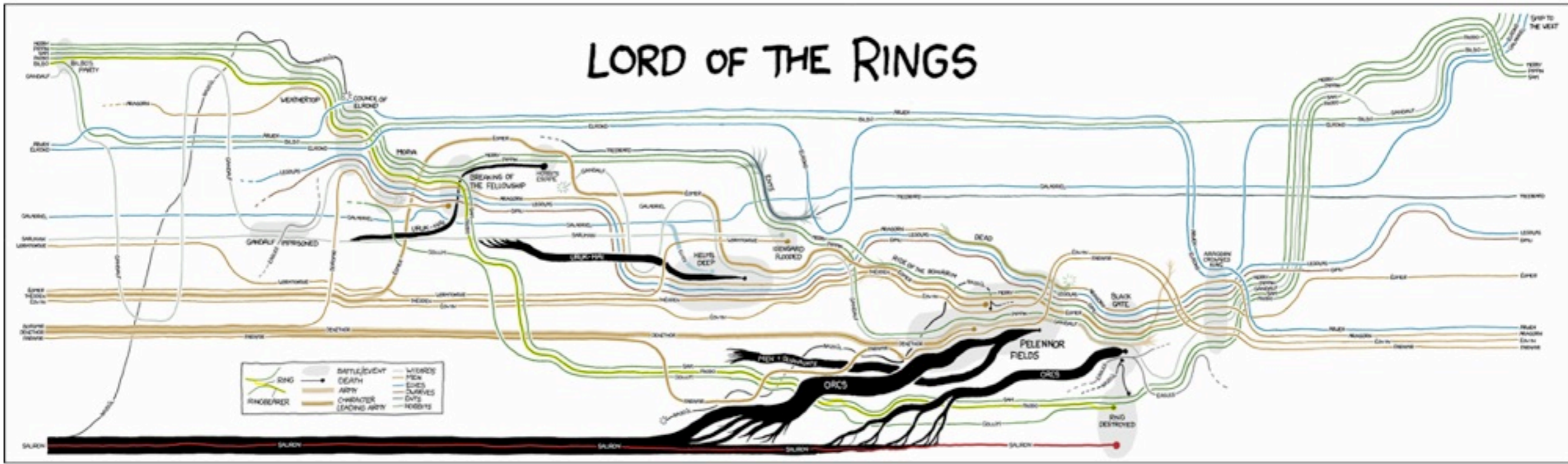

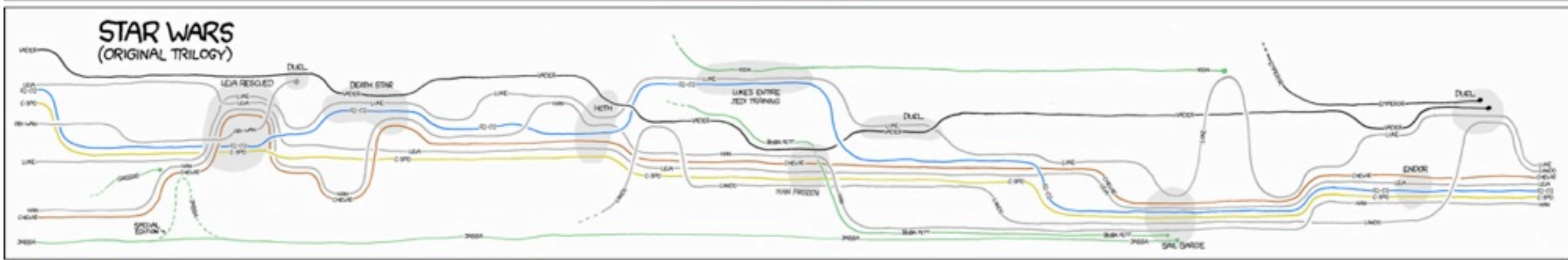

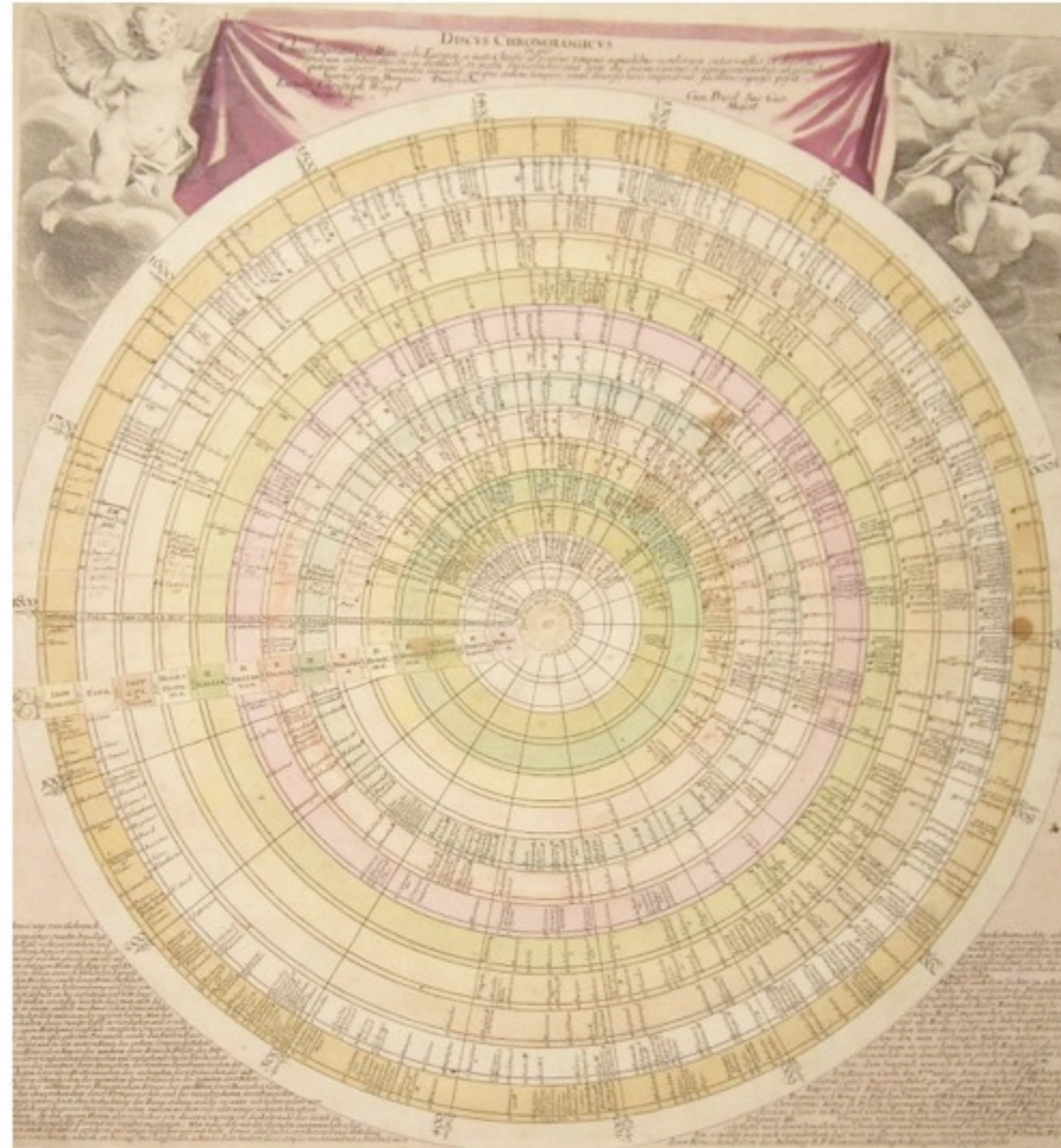


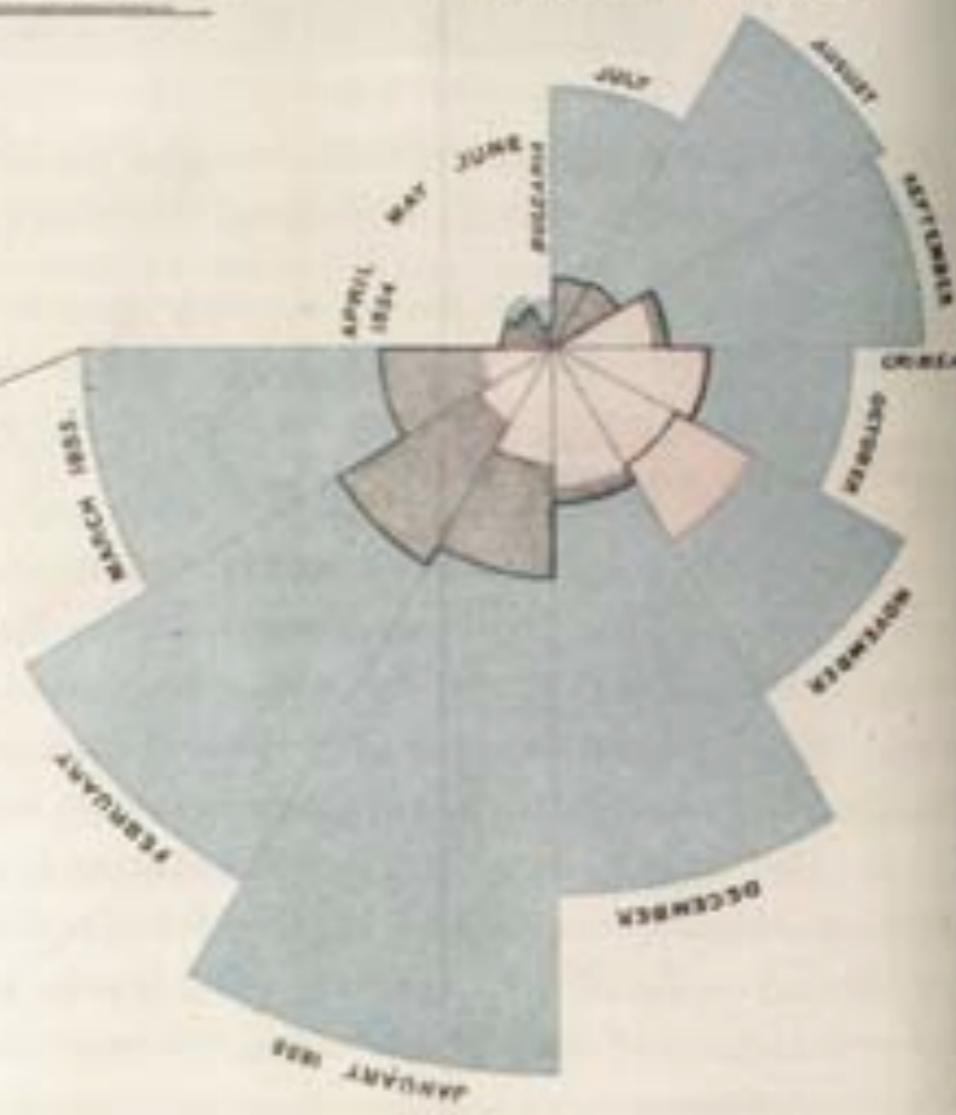


DIAGRAM OF THE CAUSES OF MORTALITY IN THE ARMY IN THE EAST.

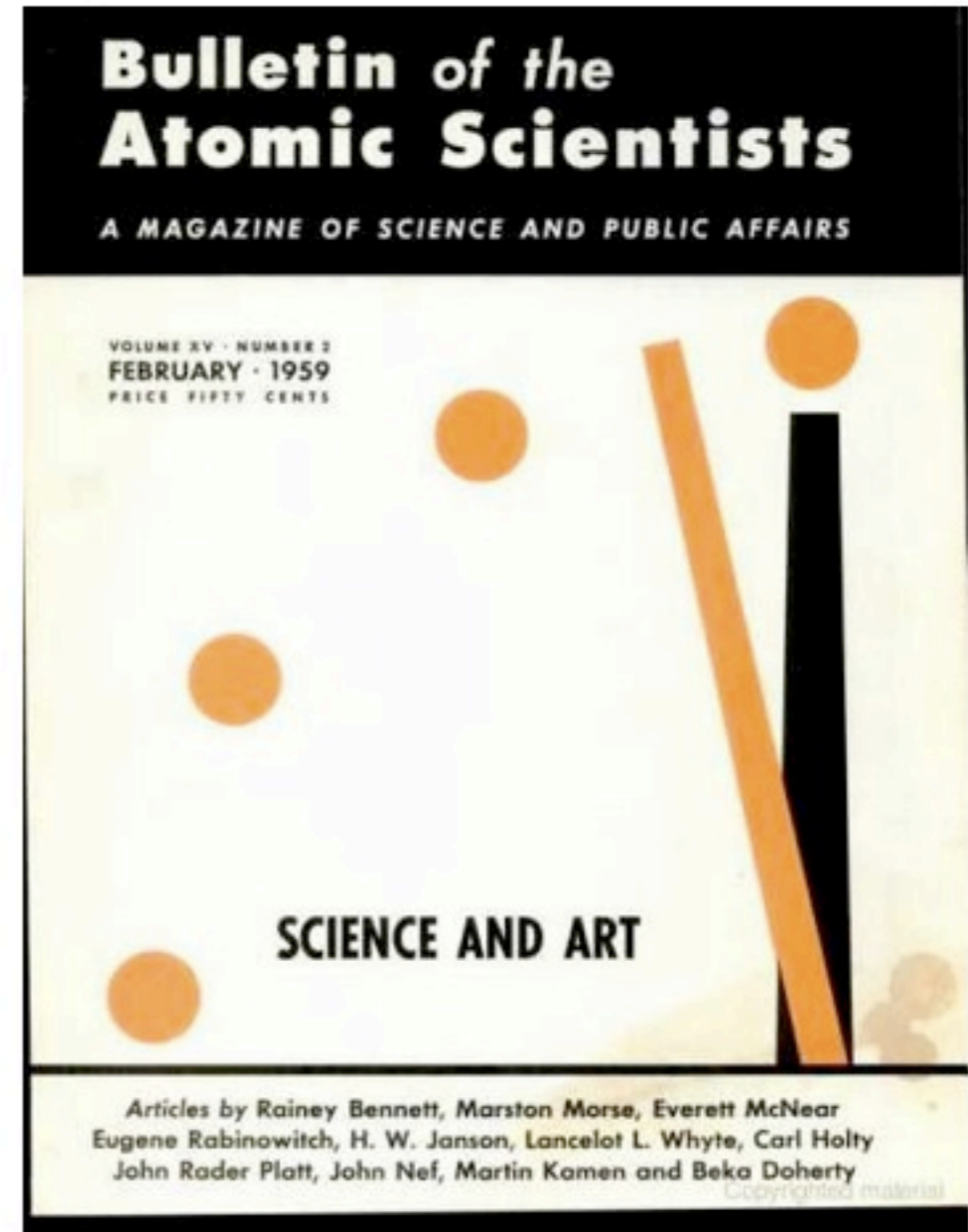
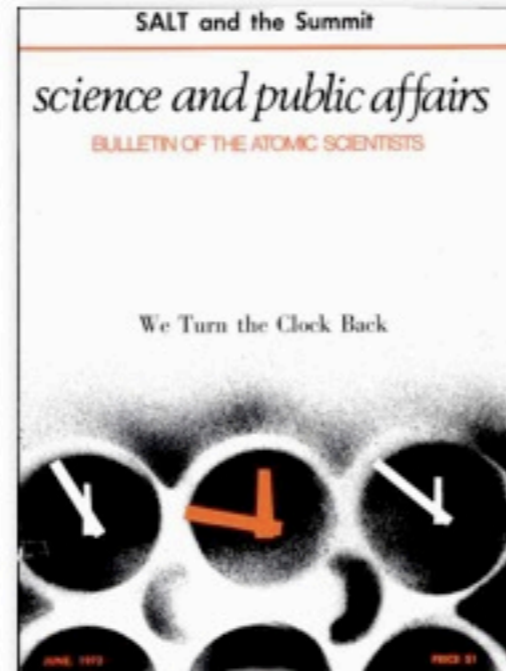
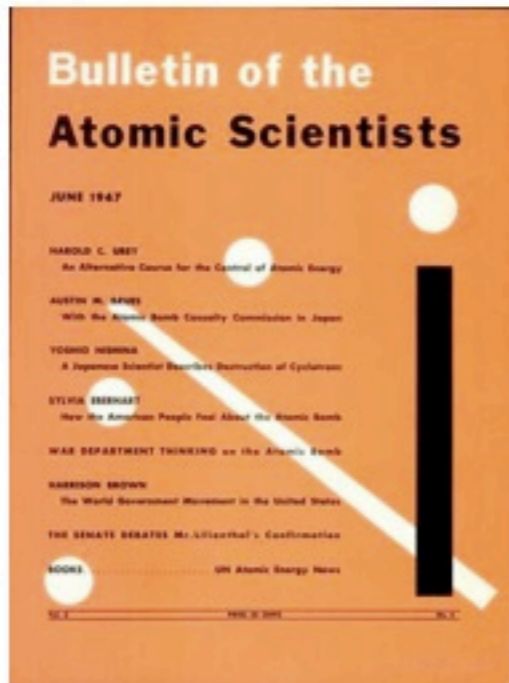
The Areas of the blue, red, & black wedges are each measured from the centre as the common centre.

The blue wedges measured from the centre of the circle represent area for area the deaths from Promotible or Mitigable Zymotic diseases, the red wedges measured from the centre the deaths from wounds, & the black wedges measured from the centre the deaths from all other causes.

The black line across the red triangle in Nov. 1854 marks the boundary of the deaths from all other causes during the month.

In October 1854, & April 1855, the black area coincides with the red, in January & February 1855, the blue coincides with the black.

The entire areas may be compared by following the blue, the red & the black lines enclosing them.

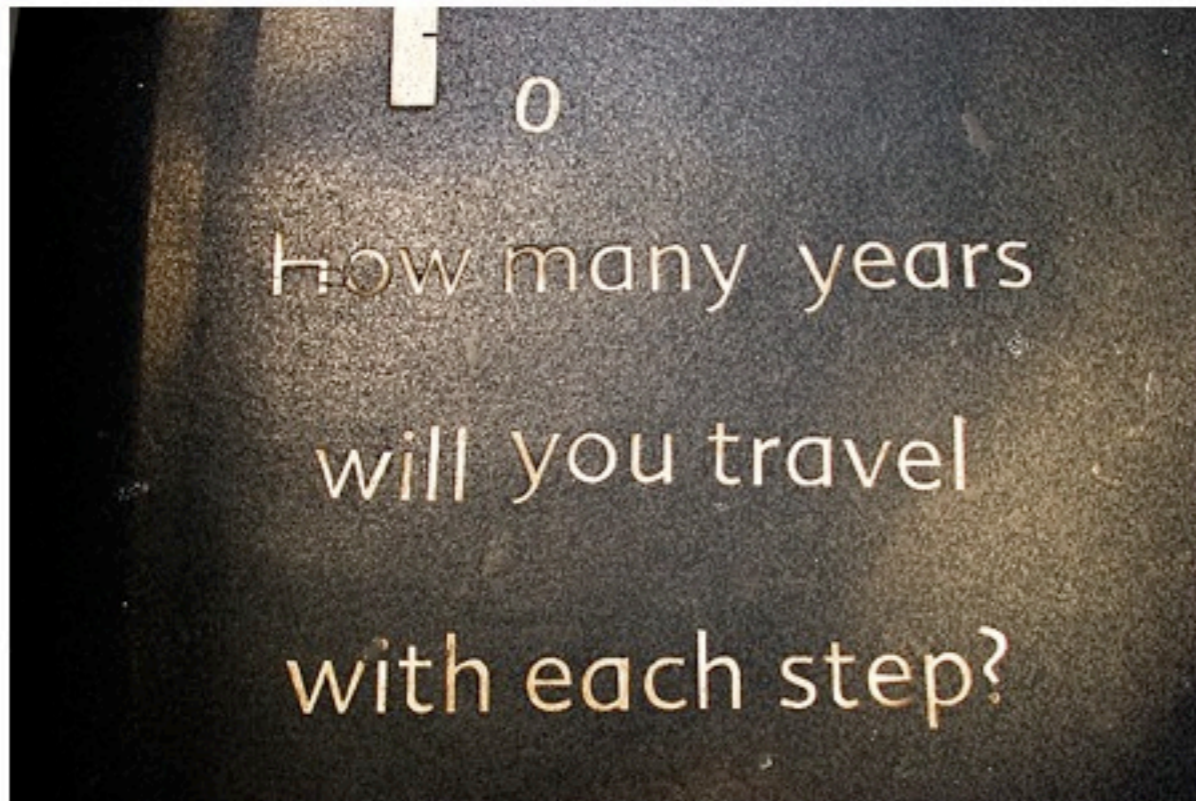
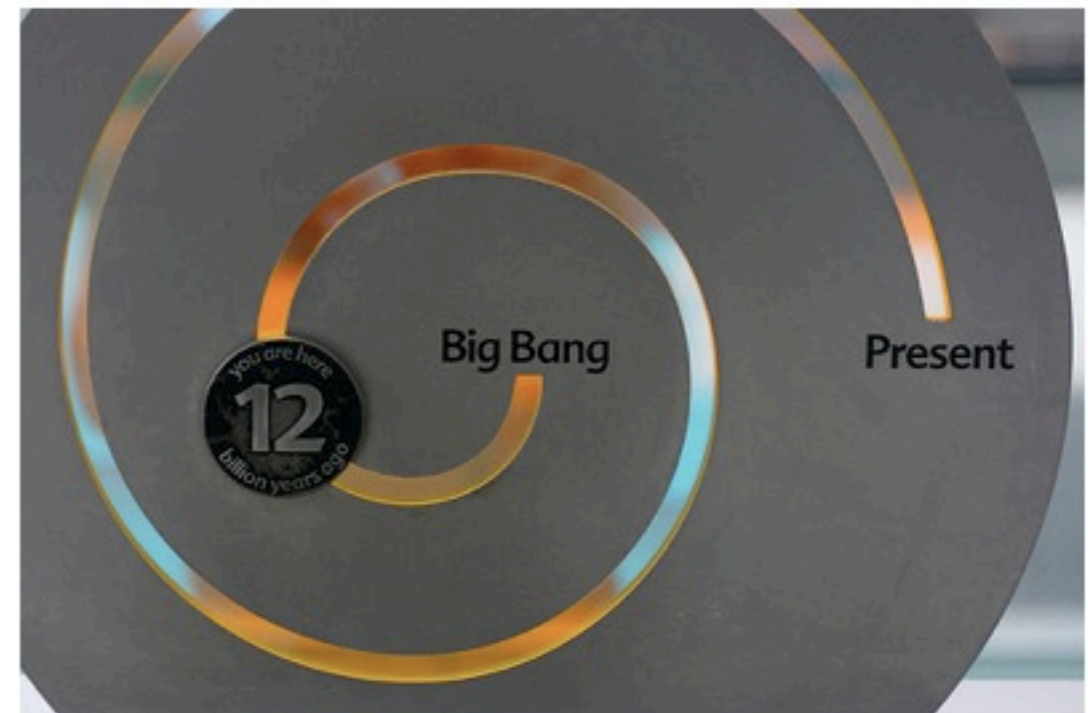

G.A. Martignoni: Historical Map of Italy, 1721

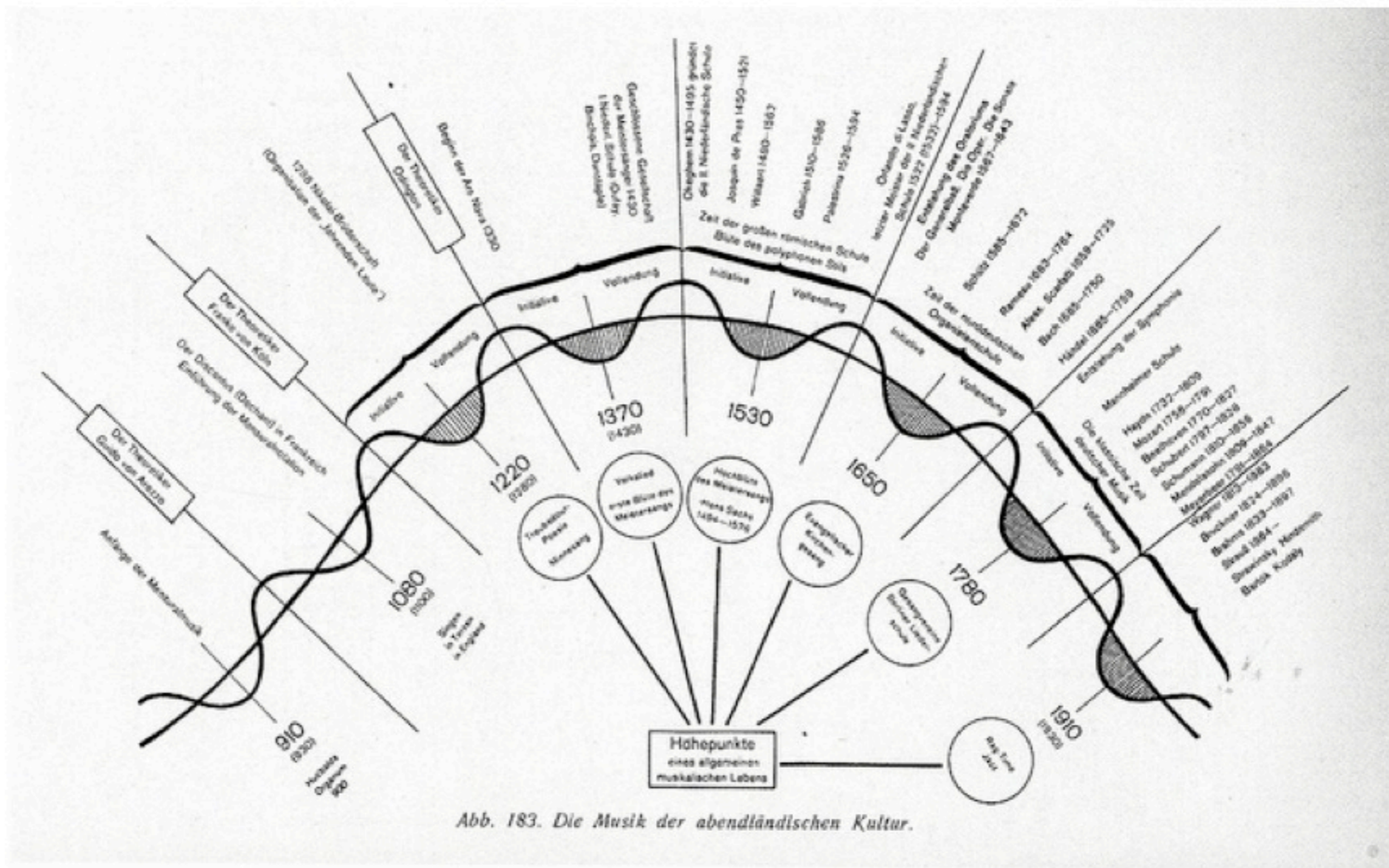
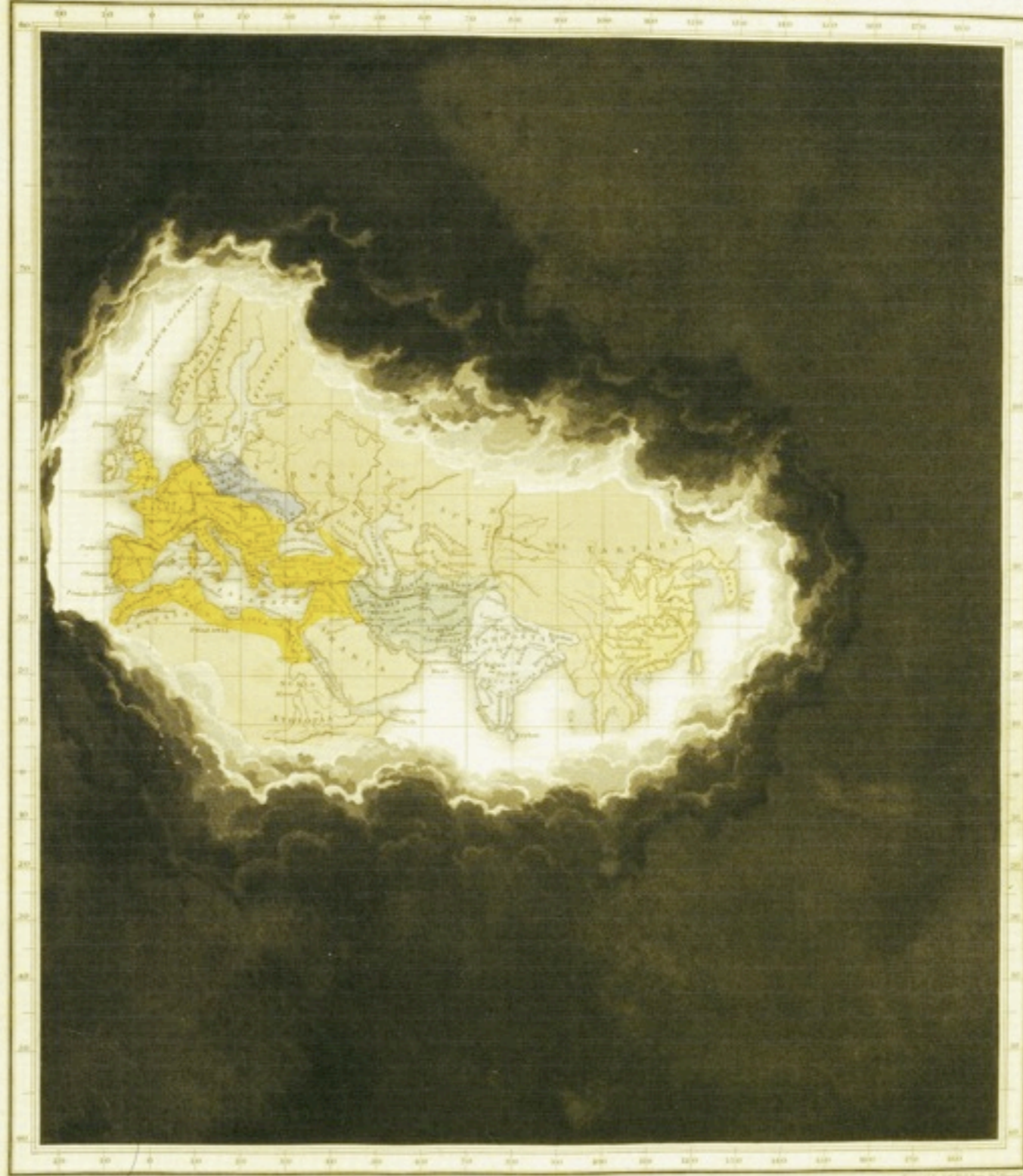


Abb. 183. Die Musik der abendländischen Kultur.

Chocolate

Chocolate is a common ingredient in many kinds of sweets — one of the most popular in the world — made from the fermented, roasted, and ground seeds of the tropical cacao tree. Throughout a course, customers refer to this cacao substance as “chocolate,” which is an intensely flavored bitter (yet sweet) food, although this is legally defined as cocoa in many countries. This is usually sweetened with sugar and other ingredients and made into chocolate bars (the substance of which is also and commonly referred to as chocolate), or beverages (called cocoa or hot chocolate).

Chocolate is often produced in the form of little sculptures, for example as rabbit- or egg-shaped chocolates, near a holiday in many countries called **bûche**.

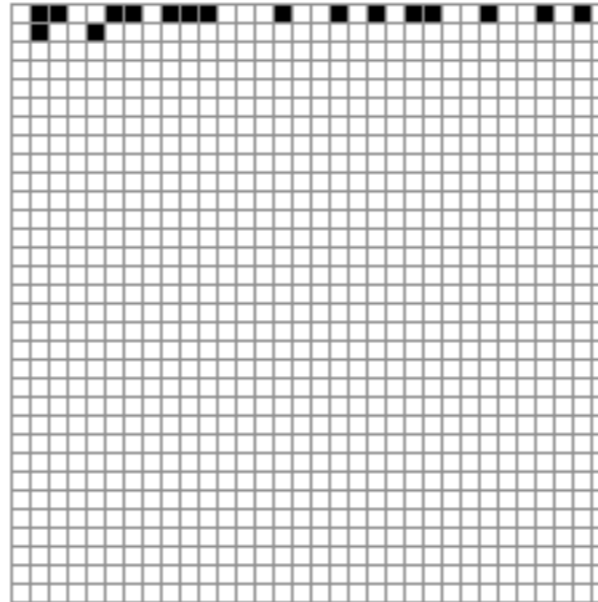

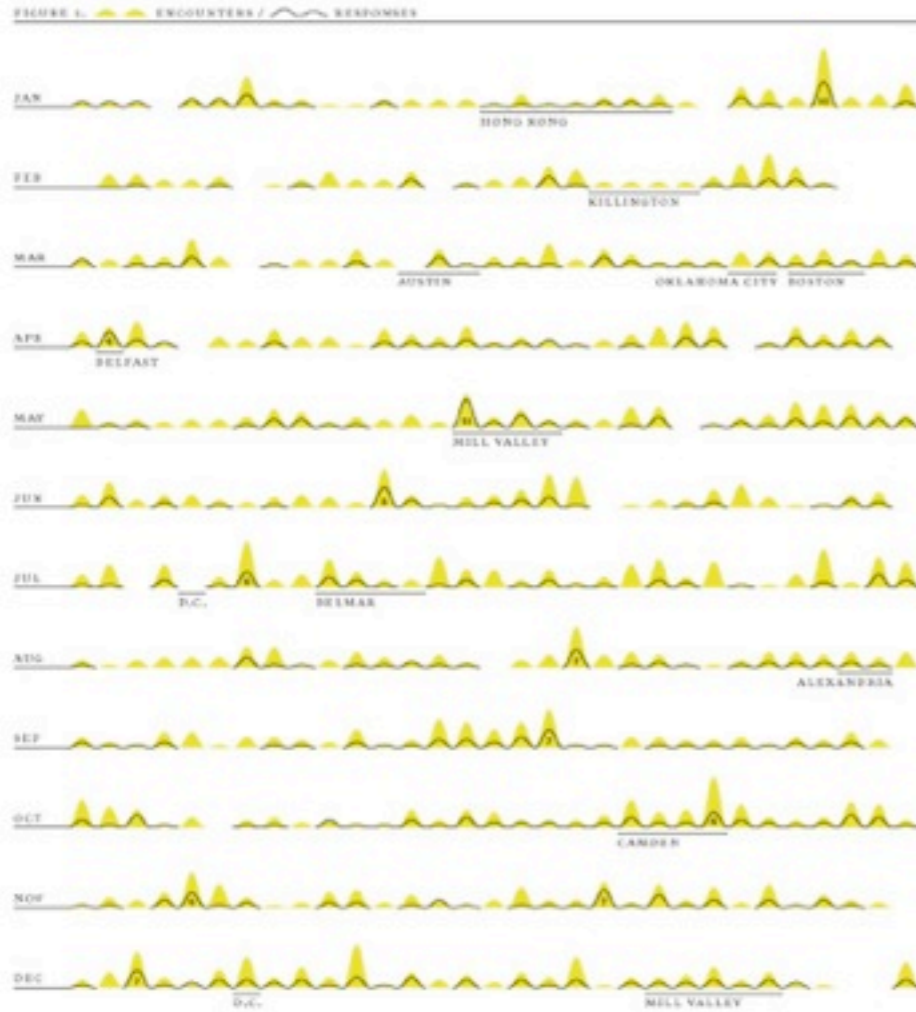

Date and location of encounters.



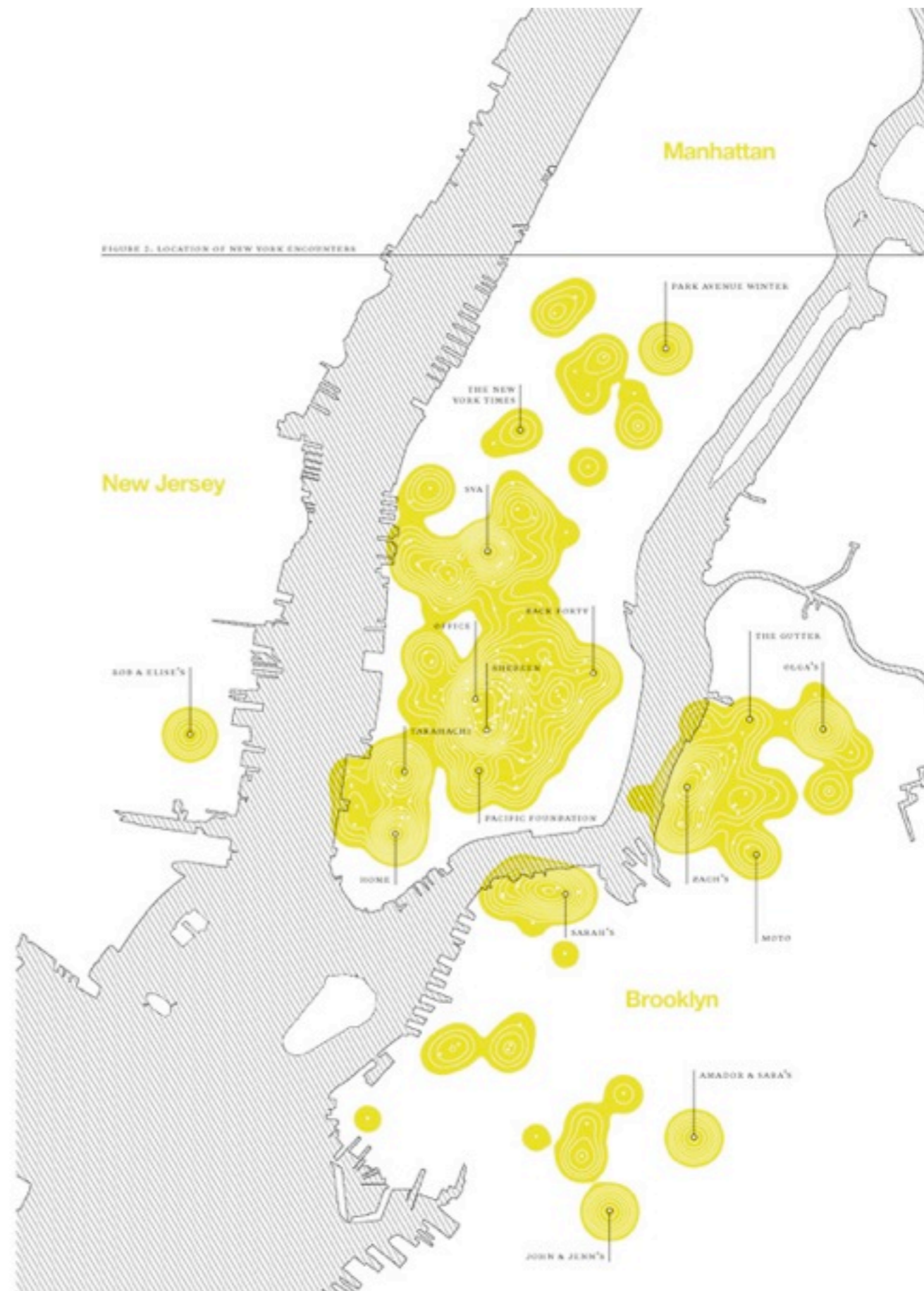
METHODOLOGY

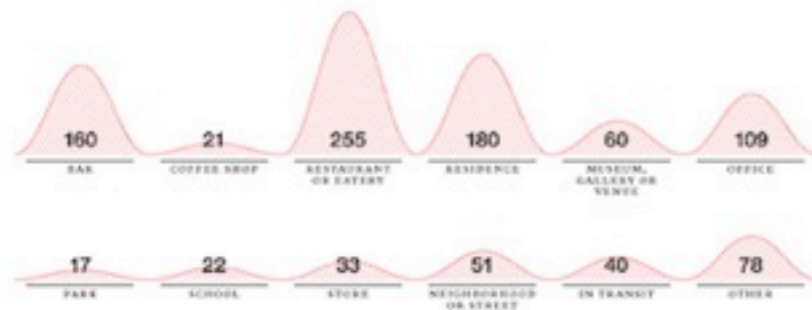
FIGURE 2. LOCATION OF NEW YORK ENCOUNTERS

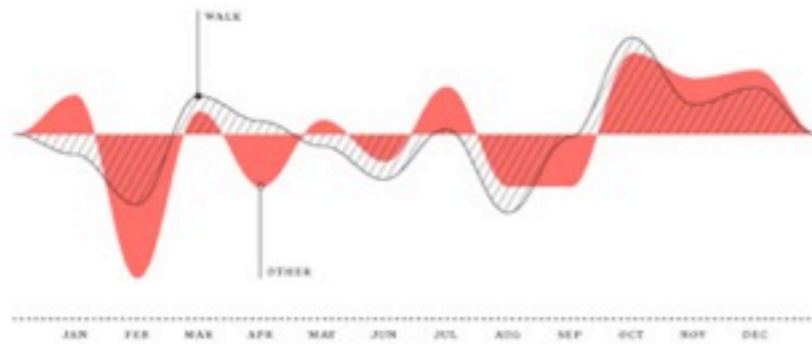

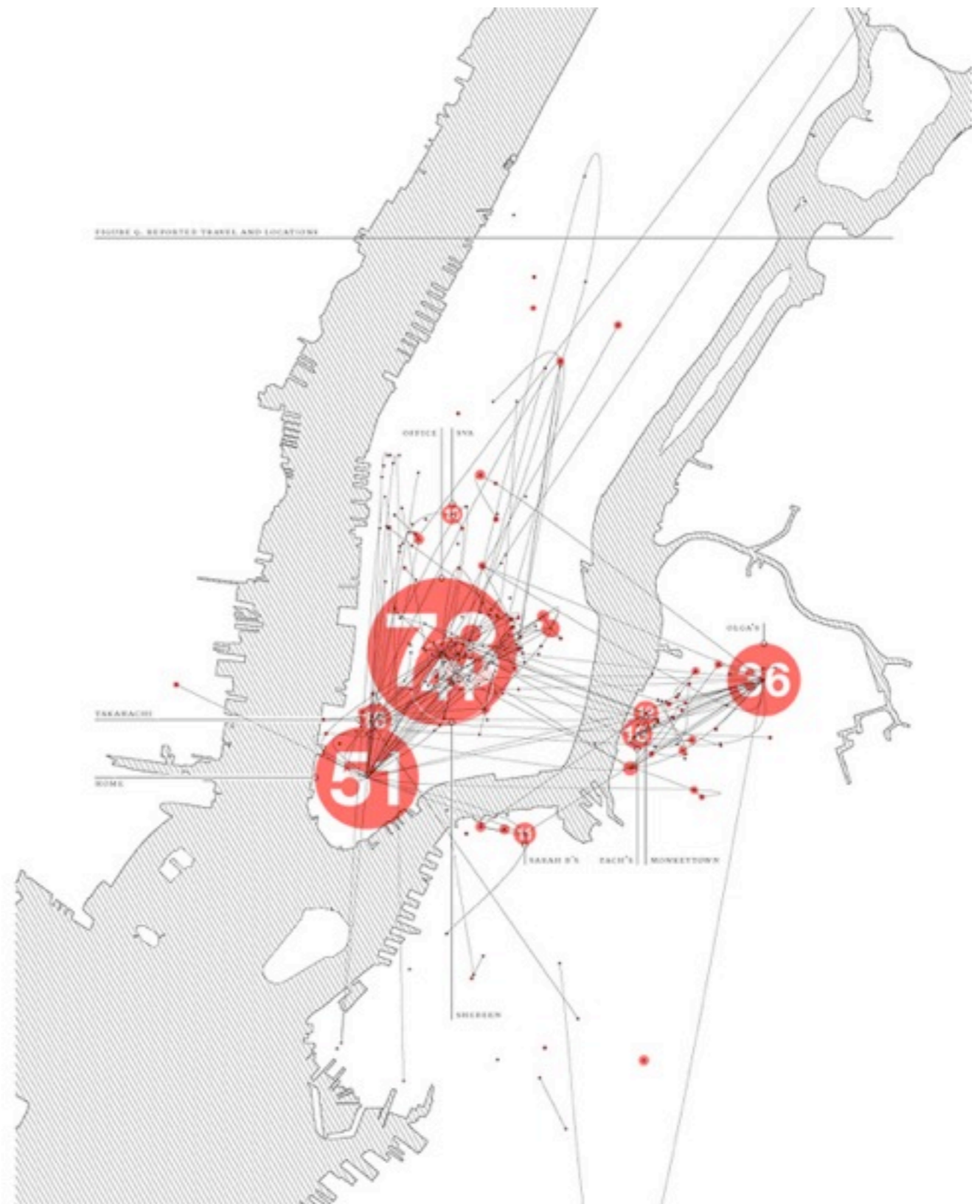

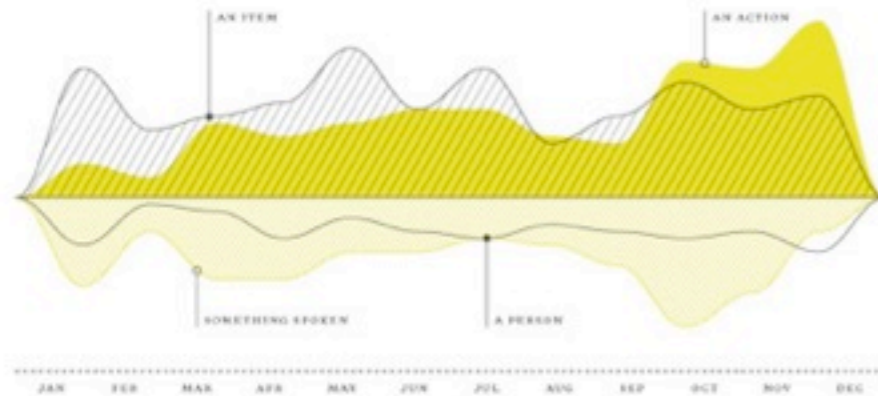
FIGURE 9. REPORTED TRAVEL AND LOCATIONS

FIGURE 20. SURVEY WORDS PER SECTION

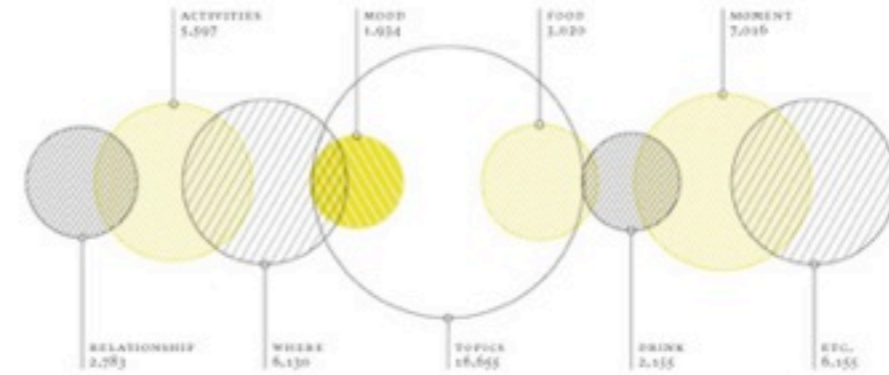


FIGURE 21. FREQUENCY OF PARTICIPANT FIRST NAMES
